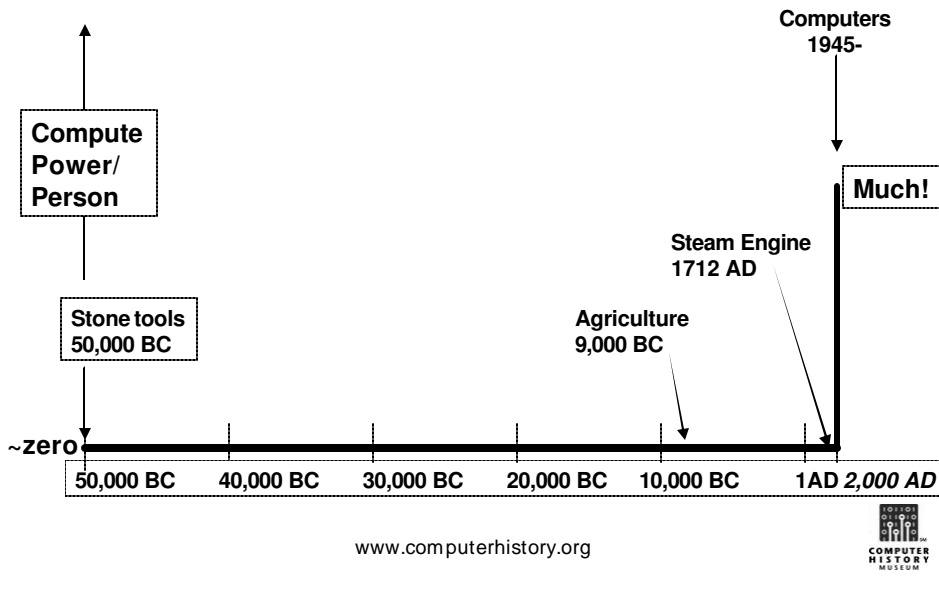


The Museum's Programs Today

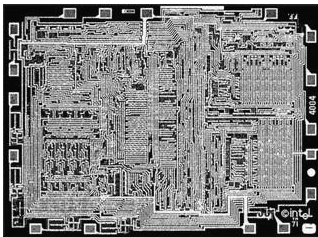


The Microprocessing Display in Visible Storage

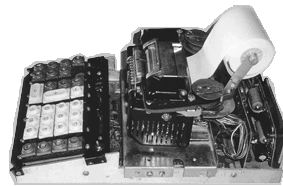

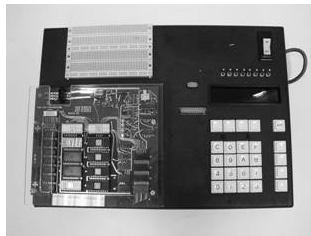
Microprocessing in the Collection

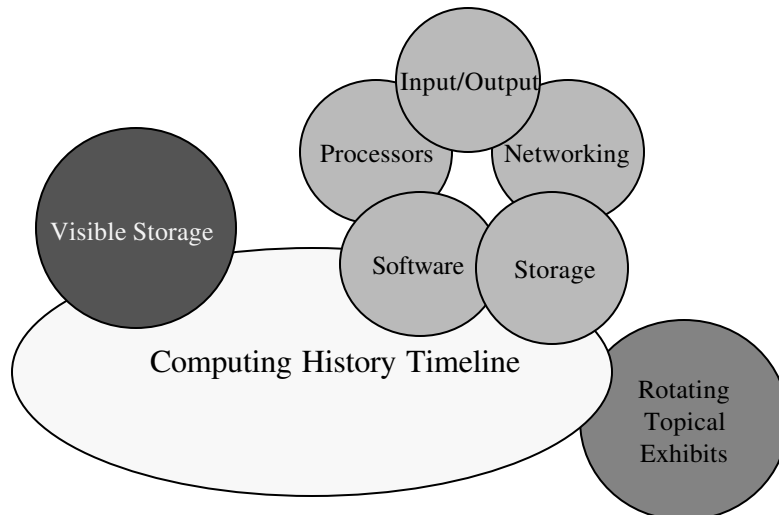

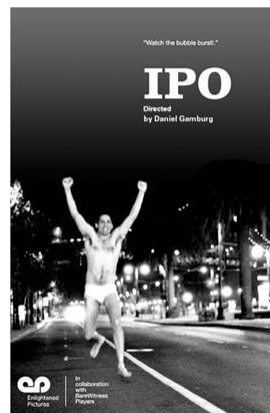
